



Mamre Brook Barossa Cabernet Sauvignon 2009

Mamre Brook is the name of the original homestead built in 1844 on Saltram Estate, near Angaston in the Barossa. The Cabernet Sauvignon for this wine was sourced from low yielding mature vineyards in the Barossa.

Vintage Conditions

Good winter rains were followed by a warm, dry spring resulting in an excellent growing season. A heat wave in late January and early February across most of South East Australia impacted the vintage, with yields suffering in particular. An unseasonal long cool spell followed, extending the ripening period considerably and ensuring the fruit developed an excellent balance of flavour, acid and tannin.

Maturation

This wine was matured for 21 months in seasoned and new French and American oak barrels.

Colour

Deep dark purple.

Nose

The nose displays aromas of blueberry, cassis, dark chocolate and savoury black olive.

Palate

The palate has a richly layered structure portraying flavours of mulberry and glace orange supported by fine tannins giving great length and texture.
